The Book Adaptation Right Area for 2016 has been edited using the information assembled by July 29th, 2016. The Industry Office may not be held responsible for possible errors.

Within the context of the **73rd Venice Film Festival**, an important new project titled **Venice Production Bridge** has been introduced to ensure continuity, but also to surpass and fine-tune the Venice Film Market first held in 2012.

The new Venice Production Bridge is established to foster the development and production of international and European projects across a range of audio-visuals forms.

The image of the bridge expresses perfectly well the philosophy of this new Venetian market. The idea consists in building an opportunity of encountering and networking for all the professionals involved in production.

Between 20 to 30% of the films released in the theaters are adaptations of a novel, drama, children, short story, comic, graphic novel, essay, biography.... It thus became obvious for us to launch this new initiative called the **Book Adaptation Rights Area** which will allow publishing houses and publishers to present their new titles as well as their librairies to international producers.

For this first edition, 15 renowned publishers coming from UK, France, Italy, Spain, the Netherlands, Germany, Switzerland and Belgium will have a dedicated area within the Venice Production Bridge located in the third floor of the Excelsior Hotel.

Rather than selecting a few titles, we have prefered, following our philosophy, to trigger encounters between producers and publishers so that they can foster long relationships.

We are welcoming both publishers and producers to this unique rendez-vous...

We are also presenting several British debuts, from Deborah Install's *A Robot in the Garden* (selected for Books at Berlinale 2015) to Natasha Pulley's *The Watchmaker of Filigree Street*, which was shortlisted for the Betty Trask Prize 2016, and Tor Udall's *A Thousand Paper Birds*, a contemporary story of grief, magic and unrequited love. In historical fiction, we have the latest standalone novel by Martin Cruz Smith, author of the Arkady Renko series. Under Children's and YA, we have ghost stories by two

very different authors, Leo Hunt and Jeremy de Quidt, and CJ Skuse's *The Deviants*, described as 'Famous Five meets When We Were Liars'.
